OUR IMPACT



Coalition Building

- > Grew membership by **234 new members** totaling 1,239 members across our coalition
- ➤ Hosted four (4) <u>coalition meetings</u>, reaching 459 participants
- ➤ Launched the **Colorado Vaccine Equity Taskforce**, a group of more than 30 members from and representing communities of color
- Launched an <u>AmeriCorps VISTA program</u> and recruited eight (8) full-time national service members to support local immunization activities across Colorado
- > Presented to local, state & national partners (i.e. the Aurora Health Alliance, Pharmacy Navigators, attendees of the Public Health in the Rockies conference, etc.) on current vaccine issues and projects
- Partnered with local and national public health partners on the Alliance for HPV Free Colorado, Refugee & Immigrant Immunization Taskforce, and Academy Health & NASHP (Community of Practice)



Public Policy

- Served as a leader on the Colorado Vaccinates coalition to advance state policy
- > Held an immunization Day at the Capitol with Colorado Parents for Vaccinated Communities
- > Supported the passage of <u>Senate Bill 20-163</u> in the state legislative session
- Supported implementation of SB20-163 through Board of Health Rulemaking and stakeholder engagement Generated 9,453 emails to Colorado policymakers through action alerts
- Formed a Policy Workgroup of the Colorado Vaccine Equity Taskforce to advance equity-driven vaccine policy



Data Translation & Action

- Contextualized local-level immunization data to create actionable resources including:
 - The 2018-19 Legislative District Fact Sheets for each Colorado House and Senate district
 - An analysis of Colorado child care center immunization policies
 - The 2019-20 School District Immunization Fact Sheets for each Colorado school district
 - The 2018-2019 Measles School Exclusion Data Dashboard
- Developed strategic plan for upcoming data projects, pending release, including
 - School Recognition Data Dashboards and Certificates of Achievement
 - Comprehensive overview of National Immunization Survey data

Community Outreach & Awareness

- Published 12 <u>blog posts</u> which were viewed 11,084 times
- > Developed new outreach tools including:
 - Hepatitis A Vaccination Campaign
 - COVID-19 Information and Resource Webpage
 - Fact Sheet on Racial and Ethnic Disparities in Vaccination in the U.S. and Colorado
 - Fact Sheet on Pharmacists' Participation in the Vaccines for Children Program
 - Colorado Pediatric Provider Toolkit: Caring for Children During the COVID-19 Pandemic
- Supported the release of two volumes of the <u>2020 Vaccine-Preventable Diseases Report</u>
- Coordinated and supported placement of 120+ earned media stories for Immunize Colorado, the Colorado Vaccinates Coalition and the Colorado Vaccine Equity Taskforce
- Honored Colorado's top immunization and public health champions at the <u>virtual S.O.U.P!</u> (Shots Offer Unrivaled Protection) event
- > Grew social media following by **360 new <u>Facebook</u> followers**; earned **59,000 <u>Twitter</u> impressions**



Provider Education

- > Hosted four (4) provider education events, reaching 492 health care providers
- > Released <u>2020 immunization schedule palm cards</u>, delivering **3,688 cards** to **103 providers** across the state
- Developed and released an on-demand training, <u>Guidance for Hosting Socially Distanced Vaccination Clinics</u>, which has been **viewed 137 times**



Free and Low-Cost Vaccines

- ➤ Helped provide **700 vaccinations to 357 patients** through continued partnerships with the <u>Shots for Tots and Teens</u> program; due to COVID-19, these clinics were halted from March August
- Coordinated provision of hepatitis A vaccines and <u>additional resources</u> during the February Point in Time surveys of Colorado's homeless population
- > Partnered with STRIDE Community Health Center and the New Legacy Charter School to host a <u>pilot health</u> <u>clinic</u>, serving **13 students and their children** and providing **34 vaccinations**
